Born in Buenos Aires and based in Spain, Ingrid Haubrich has developed an international career with exhibitions in cities such as Madrid, Buenos Aires, Dubai, Singapore, Miami, and Istanbul, among others. Her work is characterized by a visual language that combines aesthetic contemplation with social engagement, taking water and the city as symbolic territories for exploration.

On this occasion, three series enter into dialogue:

- Mareas, a metaphor for the vital pulse of the oceans and their fragility.
- Night Falls, an evocation of twilight atmospheres filled with mystery and calm.
- New York, a vibrant interpretation of the metropolis and its inexhaustible energy.

Large and small formats transform the exhibition space into a place where nature and the city intertwine. Haubrich's work invites us to pause, breathe, and reflect on howthe movement of the tides, the falling of night, and urban rhythm reveal a shared pursuit: balance, memory, and resilience. Beyond its visual impact, this exhibition encourages reflection on our relationship with the natural and urban environment, reminding us that inhabiting the world also means caring for it.

NIGHT TIDES NY

10.23.2025 | DELL ANNO | NEW YORK | USA

Between the flow of the waters and the vertigo of the metropolis, Argentine contemporary artist Ingrid Haubrich presents Night Tides NY. Born in Buenos Aires and currently based in Almería, Spain, Haubrich has transformed her closeness to the sea into the central axis of her artistic research. Her work combines intensity with poetic delicacy, where each gesture carries both the urgency of the present and the ancestral calm of the ocean.

Turquoise tones and deep blues stand out in her visual language, reflecting her passion for the oceans and the power of nature. Between journeys and residencies, Haubrich has built a trajectory marked by international exhibitions, always guided by a social and environmental commitment that expands the scope of her art beyond the aesthetic.

It is in this dialogue between seas and cities that Night Tides NY emerges. The Dell Anno exhibition space in Manhattan becomes an immersive territory, hosting a show that unfolds in three movements:

- Mareas, a metaphor for the oceans, evokes beauty and fragility through transparent canvases, painted on both sides, that seem to breathe with the light and move like suspended waves.
- **New York**, the beating heart of the exhibition, reveals the city in black, white, and fluorescent stripes—a vibrant cartography that transforms urban chaos into a space for contemplation.
- **Night Falls**, finally, immerses the viewer in the serenity of night: a moment of suspension that contrasts with the city's relentless energy and returns us to the silence of the oceans.

Thus, through large translucent surfaces, suspended fabrics, and works in different scales and rhythms, the public moves across layers of color, shadow, and light—like traversing the very experience of inhabiting the world.

Night Tides NY is both an aesthetic celebration and an invitation to reflection. By bringing together city and nature, rhythm and pause, energy and calm, Haubrich reminds us that contemplation is also an act of care—and that art, in its deepest state, remains a direct channel of intensity, beauty, and awareness.


Ingrid Haubrich is an internationally renowned Argentine artist whose work transcends borders, connecting nature, memory, and identity with a unique and contemporary vision.





NIGHTFALLS SERIES

This series represents those irascible curves of recent times, a time when life can be simply stable, time passes as if it were a slow movie, in black and white, the shocks and great joys seem not to come, the limitations are represented in the work of a single color, this time "black" representing sobriety, austerity and, at times, sadness; those circles that close and flow only inward with enormous depth, introduce us to those moments of loneliness and longing for all that we cannot reach today.

NEW YORK SERIES

In the New York series, I work in black and white to capture the intensity and contrast of the city, its lights and its shadows. On this base, fluorescent stripes appear, inspired by the neon and the relentless energy of New York, breaking through like pulses of color.

The surface of each work is crossed by short spatula strokes, incessant and tireless, like the city itself: repetitive and vibrant, reflecting an urban rhythm that never stops.

With this series, I seek to show, in an abstract way, the pulse of the city, its inner vibration, and its infinite energy.

PEACE AT ITS HIGHEST TENSION

Ingrid Haubrich's works make a great visual impact. The way she fills the space, brings together and swirls color, lets us see all that she has to say from the dramatic tension she creates in the image. The stormy chiaroscuro and the open forms that appear like tongues, seem to drag the viewer into a turbulent interior. How can our artist possess such a g raceful, proportionate and harmonious figure and at the same time contain such impulsive rushes? Ingrid does not deceive, if she deceivesherself. All this disappears as she paints.

This new series, entitled "Tides" ("Mareas"), alludes to the Alternating and periodical movement of ascent and descent that, like the sea, also occurs in the consciousness of people. In his painting, there is agitation both what tries to come out, as well as what remainsin the background.

"I would like the viewer of my works to find the same tranquility and harmony that I find the same tranquility and harmony that painting them gives me". For Ingrid, impetuosity is in life, no in art. Thus, she seeks that each painting to be the imprint of a n energy to live."

Painting gives me peace," she says. For this reason it is a finding that the work is exhibited in a center of spirituality. The blues associated with the celestial testify to this.

















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
